Introduction:

Under RTE Act:

- The right to free and compulsory education act passed by Parliament in Aug-2009 set out the modalities for providing free and compulsory education for children aged between 6 to 14. It made education of fundamental right of every child and so as to every girl child will be benefited.
- To complete the Primary Education child shall not pay any free. It relates to all Gender and social categories. Hence the dropout rate in girls will be reduced due to financial commitment of parents is not there in the education of the girl child.
- If the parent did not join their child at the age of six, then child cannot complete the Primary Education in proper period. Those children can join again in the school in age appropriate class. The policy in turn truly the girl child even she was not joined in the school earlier, can be joined now in the age of appropriate class. It will enhance the rate of girl child education and detail the gender gaps in enrollment.
- The Government of India have introduced a new scheme called Kasturba Gandhi Balika Vidyalaya (KGBV) in the year 2004 for setup of residential schools with boarding facilities at Elementary Level for girl belonging predominantly to SC, ST, OBC and other minorities in difficult areas. In our state this programme started from 14th August, 2005 onwards and after 2007 merged with SSA programme as a separate component.
- Initially this scheme is coordinated with the existing schemes of Department of Elementary Education viz., SSA, NPEGEL. The Scheme is applicable only in identified educationally backward Mandals, where as census data of 2001, the rural female literacy is below the National average and Gender gap in literacy is more than the National average.

OBJECTIVES OF KGBV:

The objective of KGBV is to ensure access and quality Education to the girls of disadvantaged groups of society by setting residential Schools with boarding facilities at Elementary level as gender disparities still persist rural areas among disadvantaged communities.

Residential Schools will be setup only in those backward blocks that do not have residential schools for elementary education of girls under any other school.

- Setting up residential school where there are minimum of 50 girls predominantly from the SC, ST and minority communities available to study in the school at the elementary level. The number can be more than 50 depending on the number of eligible girls.
- * To provide necessary infrastructure for these schools
- * To prepare and procure necessary teaching learning material and aids for the schools
- To put in place appropriate systems to provide necessary academic support and for evaluation and monitoring.
- To motivate and prepare the girls and their families to send them to residential school.
- ❖ At the primary level the emphasis will be on the slightly older girls who are out of school and were unable to complete primary schools (10+). However, in difficult areas (migratory populations, scattered habitations that do not quality for primary /Upper Primary Schools) younger girls can also be targeted.

At the upper primary level. Emphasis will be on girls. Especially. Adolescent girls who are unable to go to regular schools in view of the targeted nature of the scheme. 75% girls from SC, ST, OBC or minority communities would be accounted priority for enrolment in such residential schools and only thereafter, 25% girls from families below poverty line established NGOs and other Non-Profit making bodies will be involved in the running of the school. Wherever possible.

At present the scheme is being implemented in 37 blocks in Prakasam district.

7.1.2. Analysis of the situation and identifying focus areas where the gap is more than state averages.

As per the traditions and customs in ST Mandals women are to be always under the protective wings of her father or brother, husband or son depending on her life stage. Even today they are considered to have Special Needs for Physical protection and the Society Expects protection in terms of good School Buildings, Schools, served by the lady teachers and separate toilets facilities for girls etc.

In habitations which are sparely populated and dispersed, transport facilities are difficult and expensive there distance is likely to matter more in enrolment and retention of girl child. Some parents feel that sending children to schools may result in the loss of their income or help at home. The family will put its scarce resources into the education of the boy, believing it as a long term investment. Early marriages of the Girls or wide spread in rural areas.

7.1.3. Strategies to remove the bottle necks and improve status of girls education in the above mentioned areas.

- Conducting of awareness camps in 05 Tribal mandals which are having the highest out of school children.
- ❖ Awareness campaigns, door −to- door motivation, sensitization of the Teachers and Mothers on girl child issues.
- Implementing of life skill activities.
- ❖ Monitoring the irregular attendance of the children.
- Monitoring the tagged schools by the Model Cluster School Head Masters.
- ❖ Provision made for migrated children like short term Motivational Camp.
- Conducting Melas, and competitions of Girl Child Talent Search at District Level, Mandal Level & Model Cluster School Level
- Providing Girl Child Friendly environment for Joyful Learning and continuing their schooling.
- Conducting Balika Melas to attract the out of school girls.
- Declaration by the employees stating towards "No Child Labour in my home or fields".
- Orientation to Lady Teacher working in UPS/High Schools on problems of Adolescent girl children.
- Conducting Health & Hygiene camps for adolescent girls to bring awareness on Nutrition and Balanced Diet.
- ❖ Making the Girls Aware of the Importance of girls in day-by-day life.
- * Kalajataas, Celebration of National Festivals and Sports and Games.
