7.2 CHILDREN WITH SPECIAL NEEDS (CWSN)

A brief note on CwSN :

7448 CwSN (Children with Special Needs) were identified in Prakasam District for the year 2016-17. Out of them 6489 were enrolled in regular schools, 1120 are covered through Home Based Education and 1064 are enrolled in NRSTCs. 112 Inclusive Education Resource Teachers (IERTs) are appointed to provide service to the CwSN in the district.

7.2.1 RTE Provision :

Education is a fundamental human right essential for the empowerment and development of an individual and the society as whole. SSA ensures that every child with special needs, irrespective of the kind, category and degree of disability is provided meaningful and quality education. Hence SSA has adopted a zero rejection policy. This means that no child having special needs should be deprived of the right to education and taught in an environment, which is best, suited to his/her learning needs.

As per the Right of the child to free and compulsory Education Act 2009, it is providing Education, Aids & Appliances, Home Based Education, Remedial teaching support at school level, Providing Physiotherapy, Escort Allowance, conducting Eye Screening Camps, CwSN survey, support to Corrective surgeries, construction of Ramps with Rails and toilets for easy Access, Enrollment and Retention of Children with Special Needs (CwSN) in schools.

7.2.2 Progress Overview :

b) Home Based Education:

1120 CwSN are provided Home Based education with 112 IERTs in the district. At least 90 minutes is spending at each child house and tries to develop daily living skills in the children weekly once.

c) Status of IERCs:

Inclusive Education Resource Centers are established in erstwhile blocks with fully equipped Physiotherapy equipment and material. Physiotherapists, IERTs and Ayahs are engaged to give support to CwSN in physiotherapy, speech therapy, remedial teaching, counseling to parents and early intervention activities.

d) Functioning of NRSTCs:(Non-Residential Special Training Centers):

Non-Residential Special Training Centers were started for the age group of 7-14 years children not only in IERC mandals but also in Non-IERC mandals to provide training to MR, HI & VI children in various daily living skills, academic activities and vocational training. Nearly 1077 children were enrolled and they are getting Transport Allowance @ Rs,300/- per child per month and also mid-day meals and free uniforms. Early Intervention activity is also started in IERC mandals to identify and rectify the problems of the CwSN children of age group 2-6 years.

e) Minor Corrective Surgeries:

It is provided logistic support to 16 Cleft lip and Cleft palate surgeries with the cooperation of Meenakshi Ammal Dental Hospital Chennai. It is also planned to conduct screening camps to identify surgery required children of various problems in the month of September, 2016

f) Engaging of IERTs:

112 Inclusive Education Resource Teachers are engaged for 56 mandals in the district for the year 2016-17. They are providing special training at NRSTCs and Home Based Education to Children with Special Needs.

g) Physiotherapy Services:

19 Physiotherapists are hired to provide Physiotherapy services at Mandal level to Physiotherapy needed children once in a week in all 56 Mandals in the district. Nearly 591 children are getting benefit through this programme. All these children have been mainstreamed into regular schools. Now these children are attending to their schools.



h) Enrollment of girl CwSN in KGBVs:

There are 37 KGBVs with 7369 girl children in the district. All girl CwSN children are encouraged to join in KGBVs by motivating their parents. Nearly 78 children are joined in 27 KGBVs so far.

i) Escort Allowance:

It is provided Escort Allowance to 661 Children with Special Needs who need escort support to attend their schools @ Rs.250/- per month per child for 10 months.



j) Transport Allowance:

It is provided Transport Allowance to 920 MR/HI/VI/TB children who came to get various trainings in IERCs & Non-IERCs @ Rs.300/- per month per child for 10 months.

- Transport Allowance was released directly to the bank accounts of the parents of CwSN by obtaining attendance certificates from the Mandal Educational Officers through IE Resource Teachers.
- Escrot Allowance is also credited directly to the bank accounts of the parents of CwSN by obtaining attendance certificates from the concerned Head Masters.

k) World Disabled Celebrations:

World Disabled Day Celebrations have been organized on 3rd December in the District Headquarter as well as in all 56 Mandal Headquarters in the district with great manner.

j) Training to IERTs on MCRT:

6 day Non Residential Training is provided to IE Resource Teachers at District level on multi category Resource Teachers Training to the existing IERTs in the month of October 2016 and November 2016 in two spell.

k) Providing Uniforms:

Uniforms are provided to the Children with Special Needs who are enrolled in regular schools and also who have been receiving Home Based Education.

7.2.3 Gaps:

- Payment of TA to Physiotherapy required children.
- Unavailability of qualified Speech Therapists & Clinical Psychologists
- Lack of NGO Hospitals support to minor corrective surgeries in the field of orthopedic operations.

Analysis:

After providing Aids & appliances, Escort Allowance, Transport Allowance and Physiotherapy to the needy and identified CwSN the enrollment, retention, physical appearance and care taking of parents is improved.

7.2.4 Strategies:

It is proposed to strengthen the Inclusive Education Resource Centers by starting NRSTCs, engage speech therapists, psychologists, physiotherapists and IERTs and provide different types of services and also provide training to regular teachers in teaching of children with special needs in different disabilities i.e., Autism, Multiple Disability and Learning Disability by involving experts of concerned wings.

Proposed Activities:

1. It is planned to conduct assessment camps for CwSN by professionals for providing Aids & Appliances in convergence with ALIMCO or other agencies which responds quickly, NRHM, Dept. of Social Welfare etc., and pay TA to children to attend assessment camps.
2. It is planned to run NRSTCs in all mandals with at least 30 children in each for giving remedial teaching support, develop daily living skills and providing Pre-Vocational training.
3. It is planned to hire the services of Physiotherapists, Speech Therapists and Psychologists to continue the education of CwSN without any physical / social & attitudinal barriers.
4. It is planned to appoint Aayahs @ 1 in all mandals to help to Physiotherapists, Psychologists, Speech therapists, Parents who came to IERCs for various special services.
5. It is planned to organize Peer group sensitization programme on Inclusion of CwSN in regular class rooms.
6. It is planned to organize field trip to CwSN, their parents and IERTs in best practices of IE.
7. It is planned to supply Stationery and TLM to the schools where CwSN are enrolled.
8. It is planned to provide 5-day ICT based residential training to teachers where CwSN are studying on NCERT exemplar material at the Primary level & UP level.
9. It is planned to provide logistic support to minor corrective surgeries by involving NGO Hospitals.
10. It is planned to provide Escort and Transport Allowance to eligible CwSN @ Rs.300/- per child per month for 10 months.
11. It is planned to organize Pre-mainstream Child-teacher acquaintance programme to develop positive attitude in teachers among the CwSN.
12. It is planned to strengthen the IERCs with the activities of Physiotherapy, Speech therapy, Vision Stimulation, Counseling of MR children and their parents by involving Physiotherapists, Speech therapists, Psychologists and IERTs.
13. It is planned to conduct World Disbalded Day and sports meet for CwSN at different level in great manner.
14. It is planned to provide 3 day ICT based Multi-category training to Inclusive Education Resource Teachers. It is planned to organize Physiotherapy camps in all mandal headquarters in every week and pay travelling charges to children and attendants.
15. It is planned to construct ramps with rails and toilets for easy access, enrollment and retention of CwSN in schools with the help of Civil Works wing.
16. It is planned to appoint IERTs @ 2 in each mandal to provide Home Based Education and for running of NRSTCs and also to appoint 2 more IERTs in district head quarter in BRC head.

**** SUCCESS STORY****

PARENT'S RESPONSE:Parents are very eager to his son to send Bhavitha Center.

ASSESSMENT REPORT:This boy has been coming to Bhavitha Center, Ulavapadu for the last two years. This boy did not no previously how to write and read. But now he can identify alphabets. He knows figures from 01 to 10. He can recognize some colours. He can identify the coins from Rs.1/- to Rs.10/- and identify the grains. Not only them but also he can make piece of chalks.

DISABILITY CAUSES:His father married to his sister's daughter then his mother conceived and they did not consult the doctor up to the 5th month. They did take any care. At the delivery time they stayed at home for 3 year even at the time of pains. And then she was to hospital and got the operation. After the baby was taken out. There was no cry from the child for ½ an hour. All the development stage ran in a slow manner. The boy suffered from jaundice at the time of 3years. He was never injected for a month. So many times, the child fell down from the heights and had some small wounds to head.

All the above information was given by their parents.

CHILD'S HEALTH CONDITION & TREATMENT DETAILS:

The child was taken to the doctor. He didn't respond when we called him. He didn't look at the people. Then they underwent some medical tests. They did ENT & MRI Scanning and also CT Scanning. They declared that the development of the child's brain is in a slow manner and they told that there may be a chance to develop according to his age.

HOME BASED EDUCATION BY IE TEACHER:

From the time of recognizing the child in the survey the child was given home based education, mobility training, physiotherapy, uttering words, having awareness at the behavior problems, training to the daily routine activities. And his parents were also trained to how to that the child, and some techniques from then they practiced regularly at home what they had been taught.

PARENT'S COUNSELLING: The counseling was given to the parents of the child mainly.

- Providing self confidence to the child in a lovely manner.
- Identifying the problems of the child for facilitating good resources.
- Explaining the difficulties of the family whom they have disability children at home. And the problems what they are facing and also taught how they face that problem in a positive manner.
- We have supported the parents that we through the support of SSA, IERT, bring the change in the child.

SPECIAL TRAINING AT BHAVITHA CENTRE:

Every Monday we bring the child to the physiotherapy camp and tell the parents to follow the instructions what the doctor says to them. By this there is a lot of change in the child. There is stiffness in his legs and hands and now he is able to walk.

PHYSIO THERAPY/MOUTH EXERCISE: By this the child was undergone Lip massage, Tongue exercise. After this, his usual manner that saliva comes from his mouth was reduced. He learnt to alter some words, and tries to chew the food. The habit of putting his fingers in the mouth was also reduced. Now he is able to alter some words.

FINE MOTOR SKILLS: In the beginning stage he was not able to hold anything with his fingers in the mouth was also reduced. Now he is able to alter some words.

FINE MOTOR SKILLS:In the beginning stage he was not able hold anything with his hands but now he is able to handle the glass with his own hands and drinks water on his own. And also now he is able to hold the ball.



DRESSING SKILLS:Learned to wear off his shirt, removing his trousers on his own. He came to know playing with the water. The parent's said.

EATING SKILLS:In the begining he never chewed the food, now as the result of training, he is able to chew the food.

PARENT'S MEETING:Every month Parent's meetings is conducted at the Bhavithacentre. In that meeting the parents explains the development of their children with happiness. In that meeting the parent of this child told like this.

I have learnt so many things about my child. Now I came to know that we can achieve anything with paper training in a continuous manner. We believe this by our child.

OPINION OF THE PARENTS ABOUT THE TRAINING AT THE BHAVITHA CENTRE:

They expressed their views in the following manner

- The Bhavithacentre is giving a great confidence for the people who are in great distress like us.
- At first we thought that our children will do nothing but now we feel very proud.
- Our children also go to school regularly like the other children.
- Our special thank to SSA for learning games, songs and also providing special education and so many skills to our children.
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DEVELOPMENT OF THE CHILD;

- Firstly, now the child is identify their parents.
- There is a change in his walking.
- Now he is able to walk in a right manner.
- Now he is able to sit and stand on his own.
- Now he is able to use the toilet in a cleaned manner.
- Now he is able to chew the food and then swallows.
- By the special training at the Bhavithacentre, most of his behavioral problems were reduced.
- There is a great change in his daily routine, uttering words, coming saliva from his mouth.
- The parent's said, "we are very happy now by observing a great change in our child. Now we are very respectable in the society. We are very happy about the special training by the Bhavithacentre. They called our child by name and encouraged him a lot towards good change. Our special thanks to Bhavithacentre.

"There is a lot of change in the behavior of the child. There is a change in his daily routine, neatness, walking, Eating food and fluttering his hands. And also there is an improvement sitting at on place.

Our special thanks to Bhavithacentre which is conducted by SSA. And the special trained teachers work very hard for bringing the change in my child. Now we feel very proud by seeing my child. Once again, our hurtful thanks to SSA, and the Mandal educational officers and the special teachers at the Bhavithacentre.' The Parent's Said with happiness.

SUCCESS STORY

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T.Dinesh was born on 08.03.2008 at Chellemmathota in Tangutur Village. His parents are Sreenu and Sravani. These couples blessed by two children. Dinesh is a elder son of the couple. His mother is Meternal relative to his husband because of that Dinesh was born with Deaf and Dumb. When he was born he did not cry are weep or make any noice at the time of birth. But his parents were recognized his Dumb after his 5th month. At the age of 9 his parents were consisted the doctor and decided that he was born with dumb. The doctor advised to his parents that better to use deaf appliances and make practice of Speech Therapy due to lack of speech therapy facility in his village they were not able to do it. Moreover due to their ignorance they did go any where else and left him without care.

Dinesh cannot pay concentration in NRSTC and also cannot understand the sign language. As an IERT I taught the words to the Dinesh and insisted him to speak and learnt the words as other normal students spoken. I gave good training to him to speak any work as normal students speak. Presently Dinesh can write the figures from 1 to 250 and can write allthe alphabets. He can tell the names of the fruits, vehicles, animals and vegetables also.

Now Dinesh can play well and he got prizes also. Presently he has desired to mingle with his colleagues.
